ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

To be eligible for this scholarship, an applicants must:

1. Have a cumulative GPA of 3.25 or higher on all work at the University of Arkansas.
2. Submit a one-page statement explaining your interest in journalism as a career, and in the specific area of journalism you are pursuing.
3. Submit a four-five page essay on some aspect of journalism ethics. The essay must be analytical, well-reasoned and presented with precision in spelling, punctuation, grammar and other style areas.
4. Provide samples of journalistic work done in class or professionally (for example, articles published in newspapers or magazines, videotapes, press releases, advertisements, etc.)
5. Provide a current resume, which must include a record of employment.
6. Provide a listing of all journalism courses taken at the University of Arkansas.
